

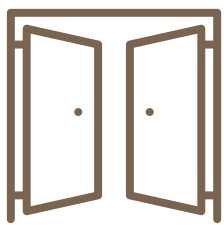
RETURNING TO MASS

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW



ATTENDING MASS

- Mass will continue to be celebrated on Saturdays at 4:30 p.m. and Sundays at 9:15 and 11:15 a.m.
- The 7:30 a.m Mass will now be celebrated at 7:00 a.m.
- Church doors will open 30 minutes prior to Mass.
- All entrances will be open with the exception of the Welcome Center entrance.
- All guests are encouraged to wear masks. We have a limited supply of one-time use masks available.
- The obligation to attend Mass has been suspended until July 5.
- Our 9:15 a.m. Mass will continue to be live-streamed each week.



ENTERING & SEATING

- We are limited to 25 percent of our seating capacity, which is roughly 200 seats.
- Seating will be available on a first-come basis.
- Those who live in the same household will be allowed to sit together.
- As you enter, the Order of Worship will not be distributed.
- Gather hymnals will not be available in pews; however, music will be shared on screens as usual.
- Hospitality volunteers will be available to assist you with entering the building and finding appropriate seating.



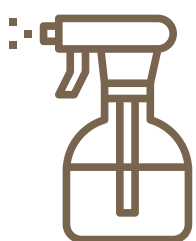
MODIFICATIONS TO MASS

- Music will be led by cantors and a few instrumentalists, but there will be no choirs.
- Your offertory will be collected in the wooden boxes near the entrance. There will be no collection during Mass using baskets.
- There will be no Presentation of Gifts or physical contact during the Sign of Peace.
- Communion will be distributed only in the hand, and we will not be sharing from the cup.



DISMISSAL

- Rows will be dismissed one at a time, starting from the back of the church to allow for appropriate social distancing.
- Paper bulletins will not be distributed at this time; however, all parish announcements (including Mass intentions) are published on www.hanb.org.
- Fellowship after Mass will not take place for the foreseeable future.
- Groups should avoid congregating in the church, Welcome Center and parking lot after Mass.



FACILITIES

- Hand sanitizer will be available as you enter the church and as you approach the altar for Communion.
- Frequently touched surfaces, including pews, door handles and restrooms will be sanitized per CDC guidelines after every Mass.
